CORPUS CHRISTI, THE SOLEMNITY OF THE SACRED BODY AND BLOOD OF JESUS which is given to us in the Most Holy Eucharistic, is a profound and powerful Solemnity in the liturgical year of the Catholic Church. Though this Solemnity has been transferred to Sunday in the US, the Church in much of the world celebrated it on Thursday. Whenever it is celebrated, it is meant to be a richly significant day in Catholic Christian life. This Solemnity honors Jesus Christ, Really, Truly and Substantially Present under the appearances of bread and wine. This Presence happen through the change which the Church calls transubstantiation (“change of substance”), when at the Consecration of the Mass, the priest says the words which Christ Himself pronounce over bread and wine, “This is My Body”, “This is the chalice of My Blood”, “Do this in remembrance of Me.”
